NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that the plans and specifications for this project have been revised as prescribed by this Addendum. It is mandatory that all bidders comply with the changes detailed herein. This Addendum shall be signed by the Bidder and attached to the inside of the Contract Documents. All changes, omissions, additions and alterations in, on and to the Contract Documents and Specification will apply to proposals made for the execution of the various parts of the work affected thereby. Careful note of this Addendum shall be taken by all parties of interest so that the proper allowance may be made in all computations, estimates and contracts, and all trades affected shall be fully advised in the performance of the work which will be required by them. In cases of conflict between the Plans, Specifications and this Addendum, this Addendum shall govern.

**RESPONSE TO REQUESTS FOR INFORMATION (RFI):**

**QUESTION NO. 1 –**

**QUESTION:** Can we leave drill cuttings next to each drilling location? If not, is there a place nearby where we can dispose of the drill cuttings, drilling mud, and development water?

**RESPONSE:** Contractor can dispose of drill cuttings, drilling mud and development water on City property adjacent to the north of the ponds.

**QUESTION NO. 2 –**

**QUESTION:** How long will it take to decide exact well construction once an electrical and sonic log is provided?

**RESPONSE:** About one hour.

**QUESTION NO. 3 –**

**QUESTION:** Do we need to provide a dedicated pump for each well to be the property of the owner once the project is complete? Or will we use our own pump for development purposes and keep the pump after the project is complete.

**RESPONSE:** Provide dedicated pumps to become the property of the City.

**QUESTION NO. 4 -**

**QUESTION:** For Well Development the bid shows an estimate of 4 hours for pumping and surging. Is there a contingency bid item that can be used if it takes longer to develop the wells?

**RESPONSE:** If it takes longer to develop, the City will pay a per hour cost by a negotiated contract change order.

**QUESTION NO. 5 –**


**QUESTION:** Is water available onsite?

**RESPONSE:** Water is available from a City fire hydrant on Sierra Avenue located north of the ponds.
